Kalle and her Favourite Traditional Game







This game is played by two or more players. A point is scored when a player completes the four steps in throwing and catching the five 'pebbles'. The aim is to score as many points as possible!

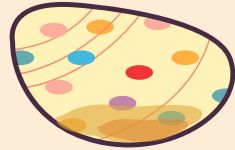
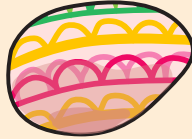

'5 Pebbles'

A traditional game in Kindsville



The objective of the game is to score as many points as possible. To score a point, a player has to complete a number of 4 steps.

GAME PLAY

Place all 5 pebbles on the ground.

- 1 Toss one pebble in the air. Pick up one pebble and catch the pebble in the air before it falls to the ground. Repeat this step until you have all five pebbles in your hand.
- 2 Toss one pebble, and pick up two. Repeat the process, but this time pick up two pebbles before catching the tossed pebble. On the second throw, pick up the two remaining pebbles.
- 3 Toss one pebble, and pick up three. Repeat it again, picking up three pebbles and then one pebble.
- 4 Toss one pebble, and pick up four. Finally, pick up all four pebbles before catching the tossed pebble.

★★ If at any point in time the player fails to complete this set of four steps, he/she will have to forfeit his turn.

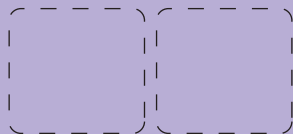

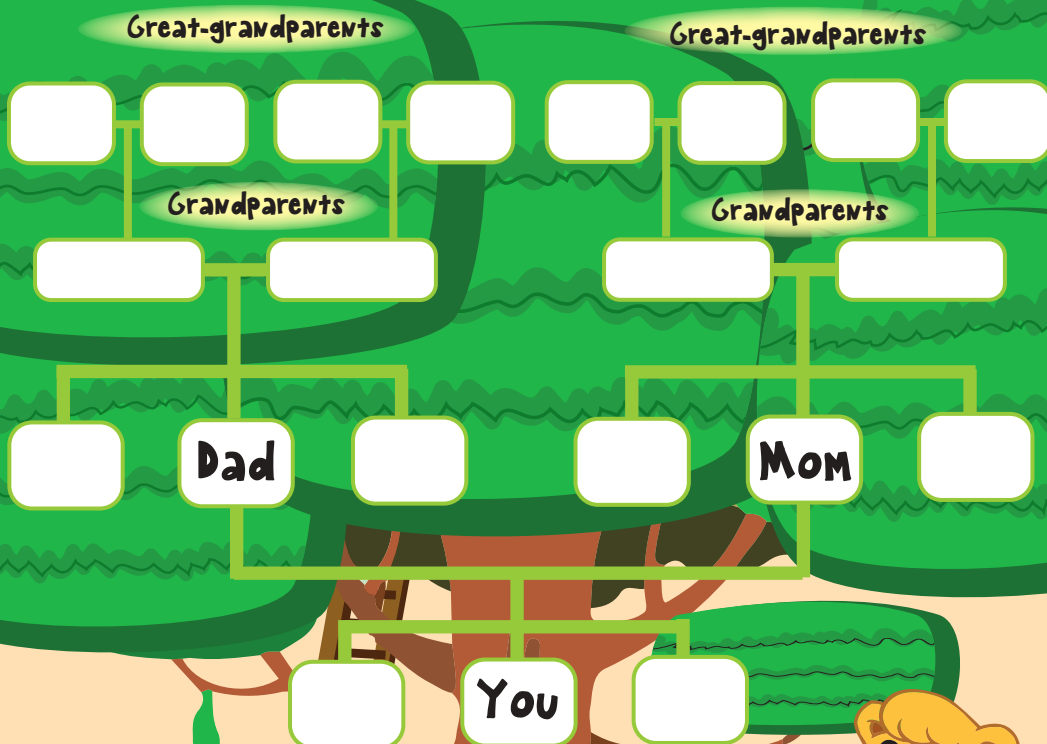


Trace your Roots

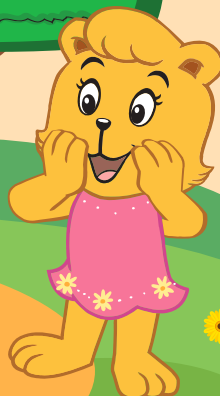
Create a Family Tree

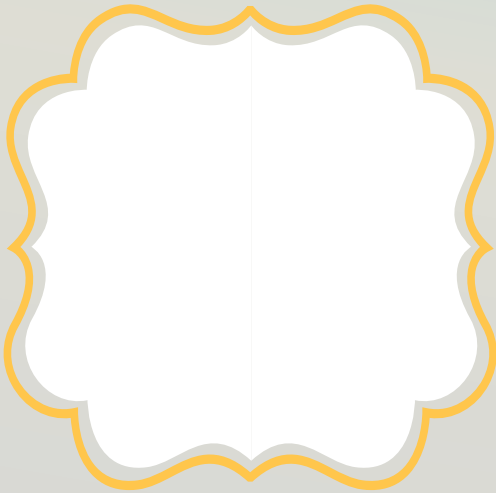

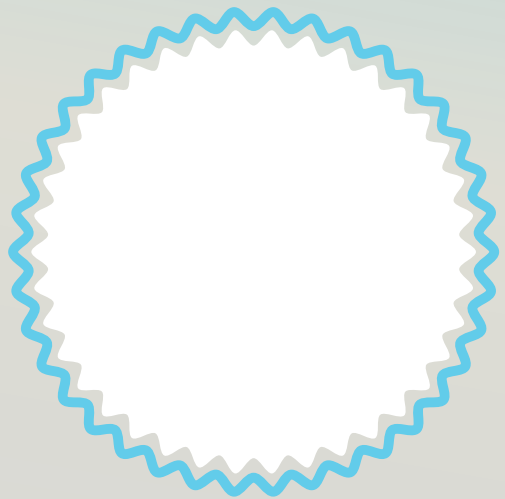

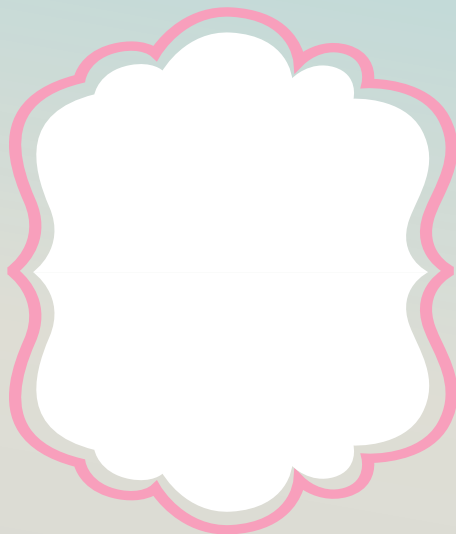
