






**'Mummy, Mummy,

Why do you pout?'**

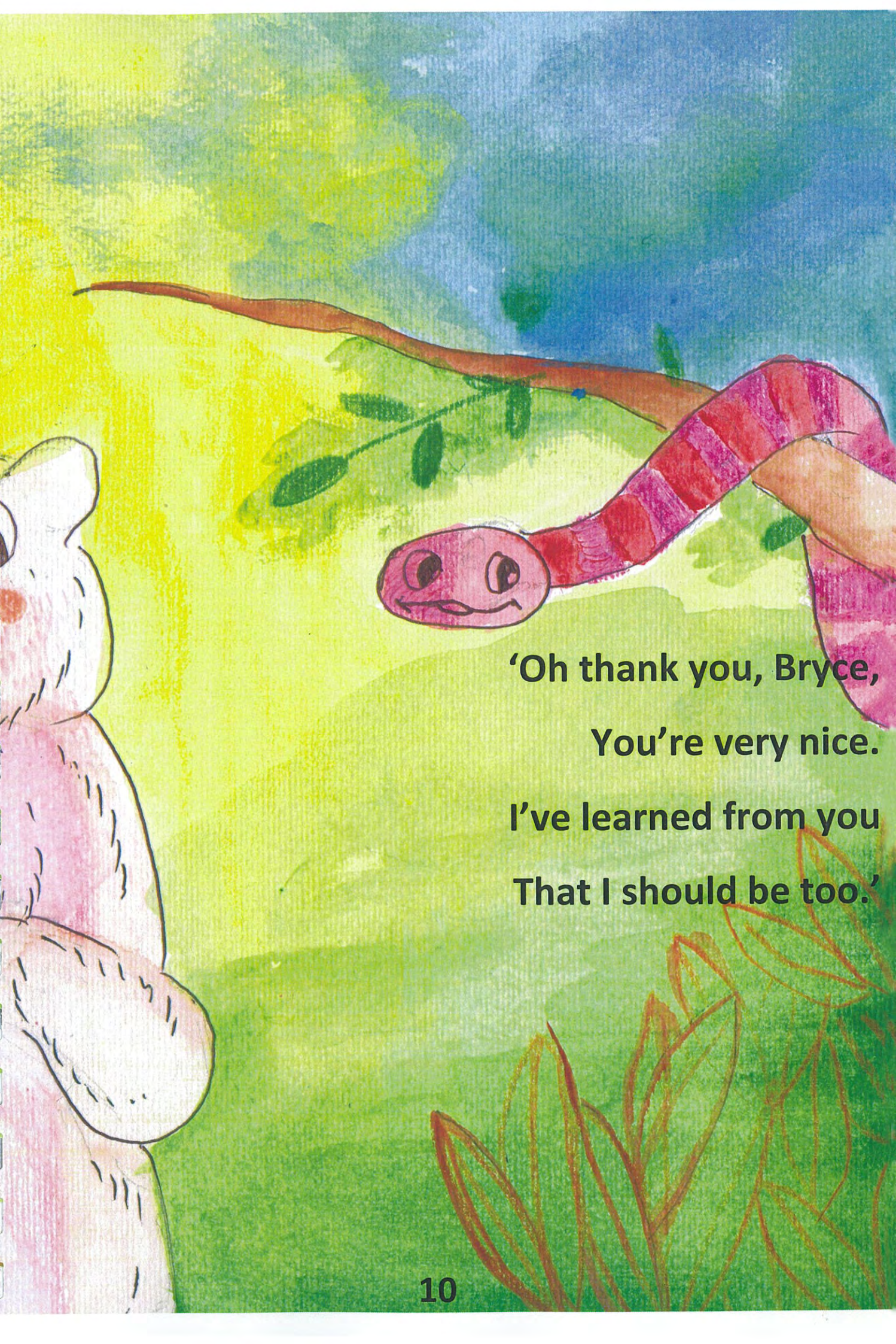


**'There's a thorn in my

That I should be too.'**

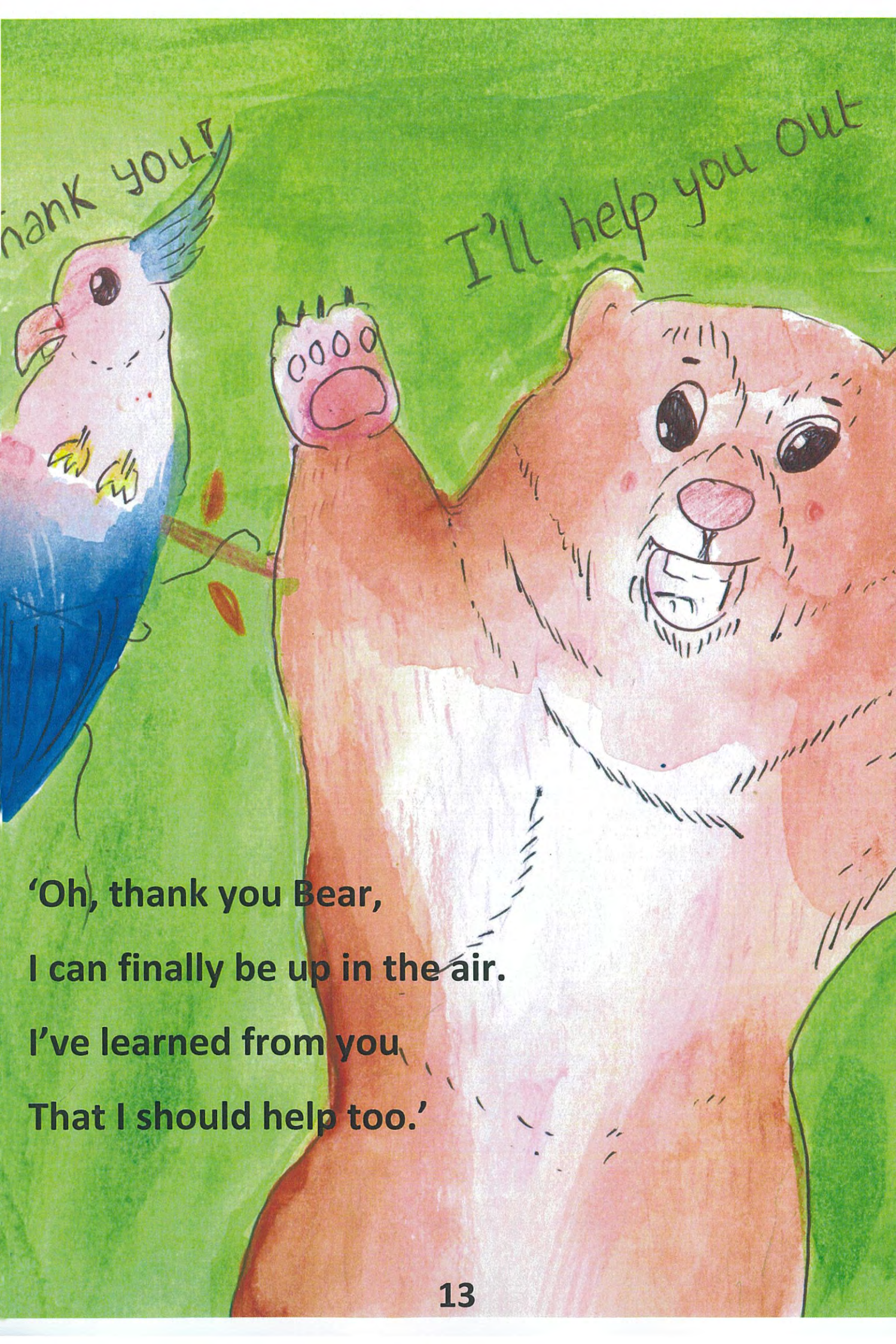
'Dear Macaw, dear Macaw.

And I cannot escape.’**

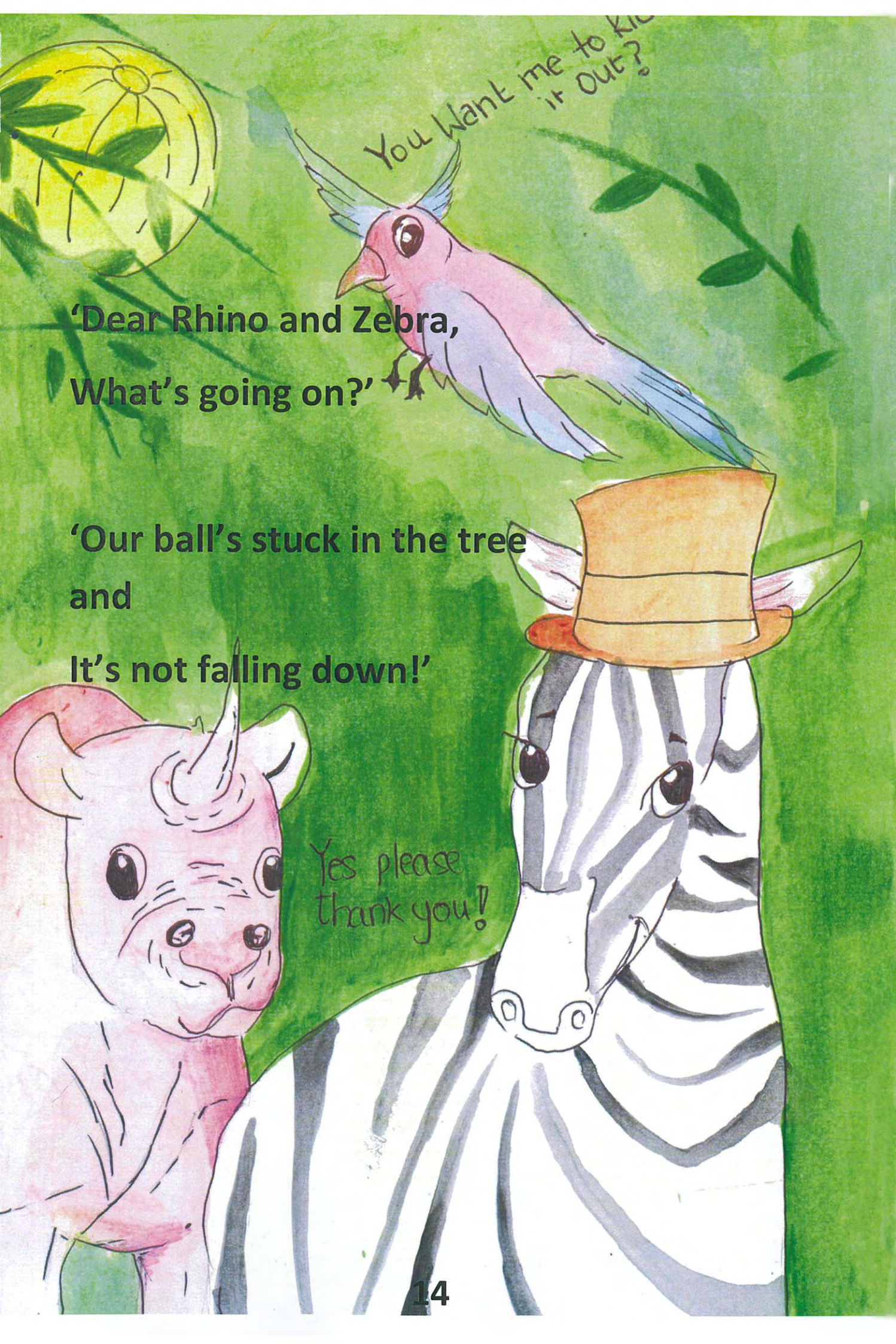




Thank you!

That we should make others happy too.'**



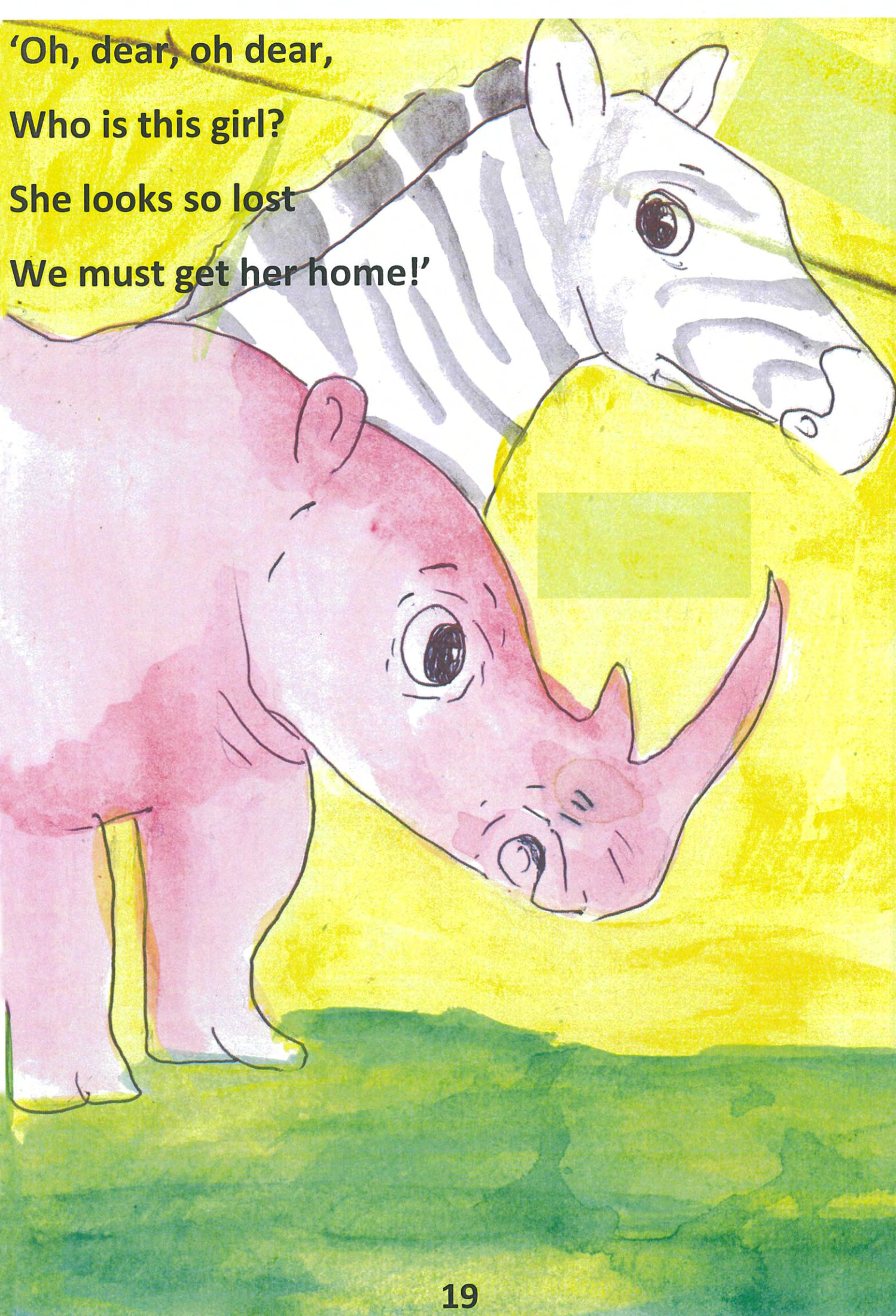


Where am I ?

We must get her home!'**



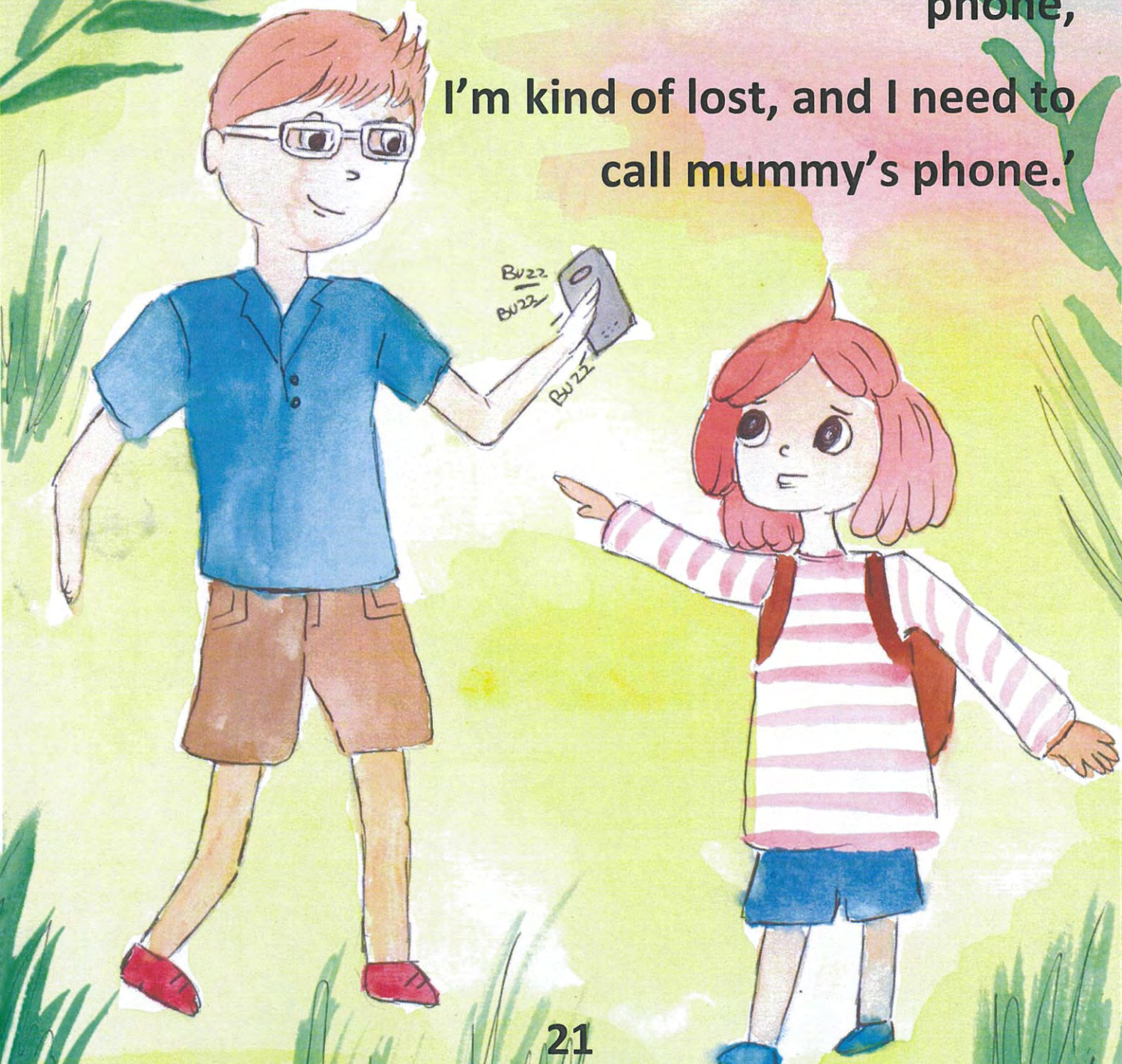
**'Please do help me

You must ask for an adult's phone, nicely.'**

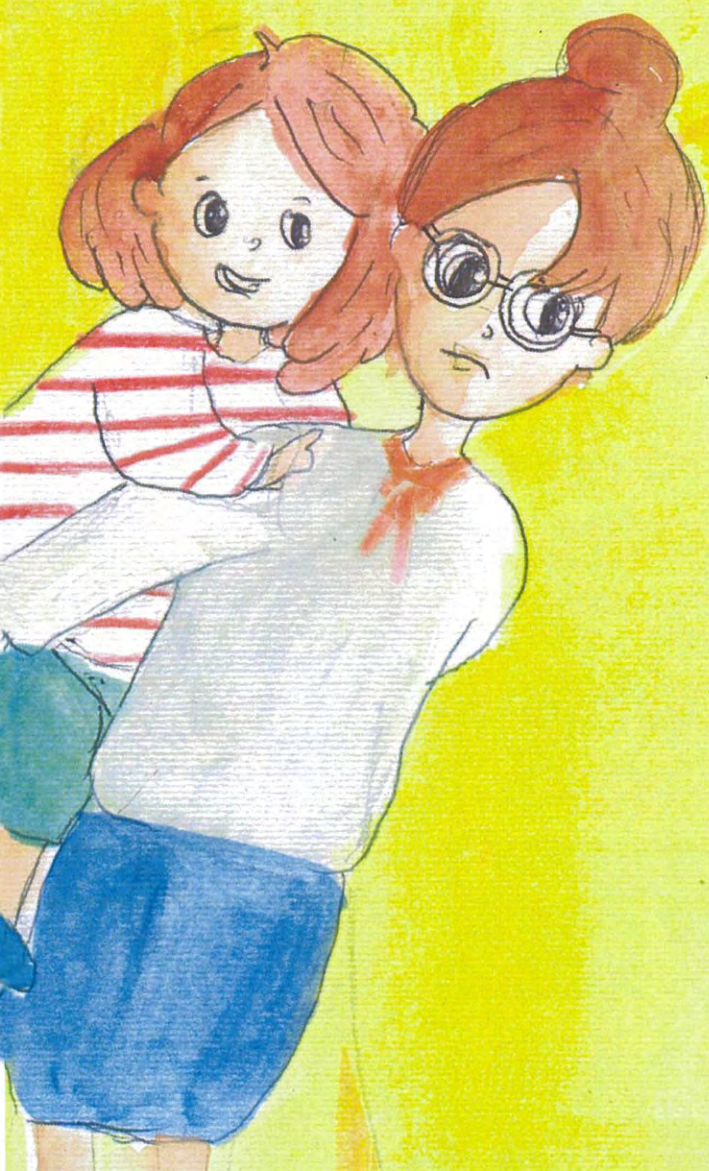
**'Hello mister, can I borrow your

call mummy's phone.'**



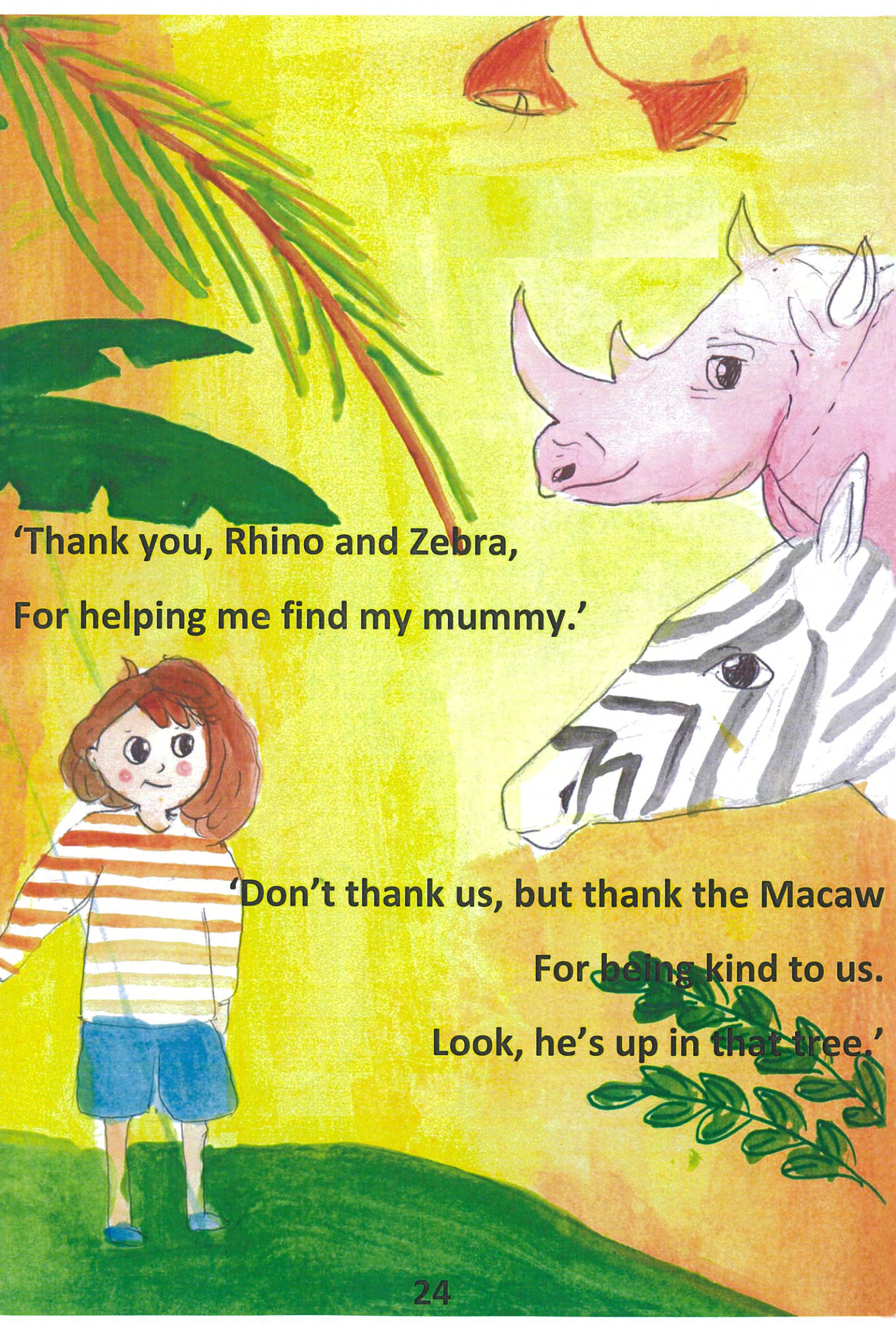
**‘Mummy, mummy,

For helping me find my mummy.’**

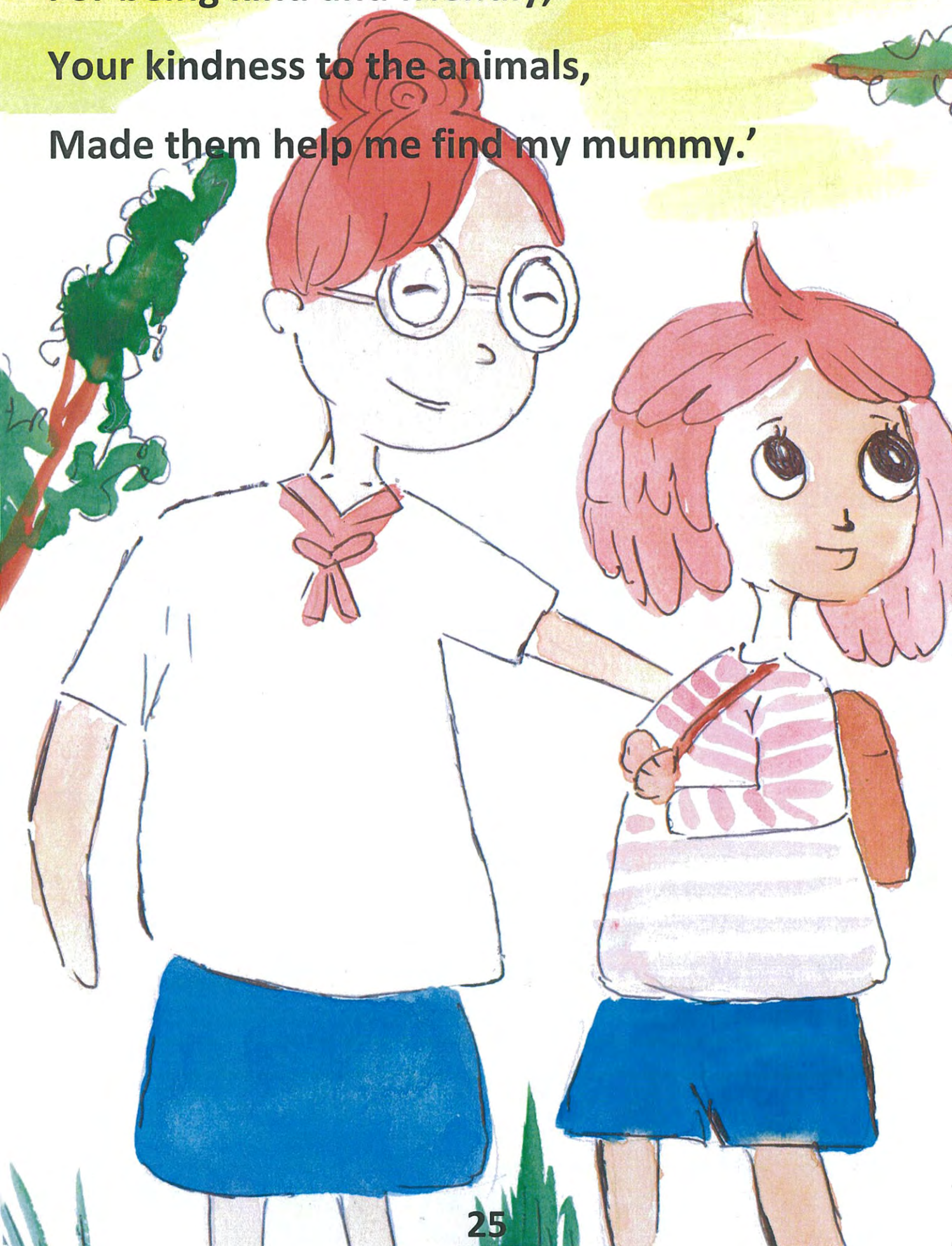
**‘Don’t thank us, but thank the Macaw

Look, he’s up in that tree.’**

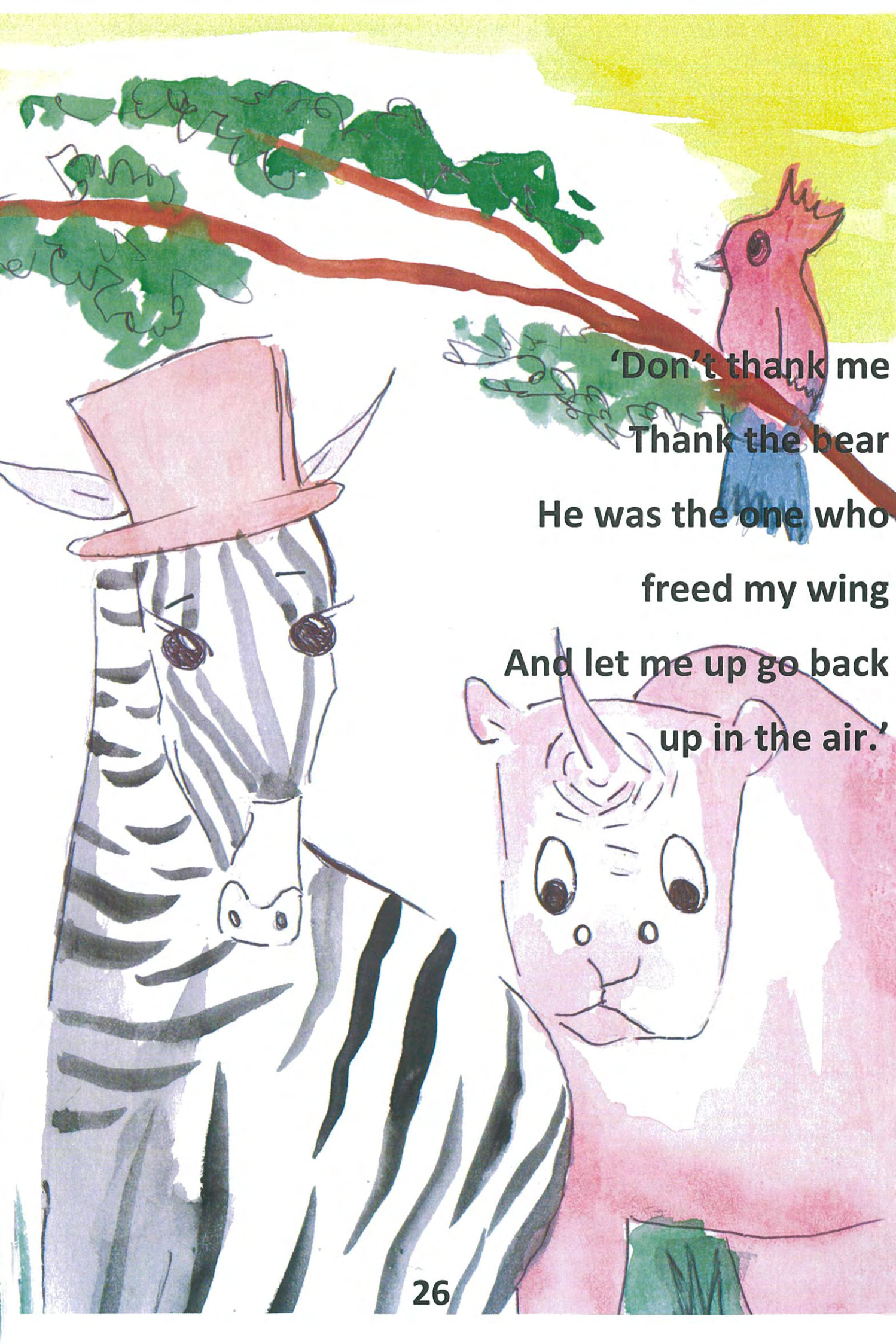
'Oh, thank you, dearest Macaw

Made them help me find my mummy.'



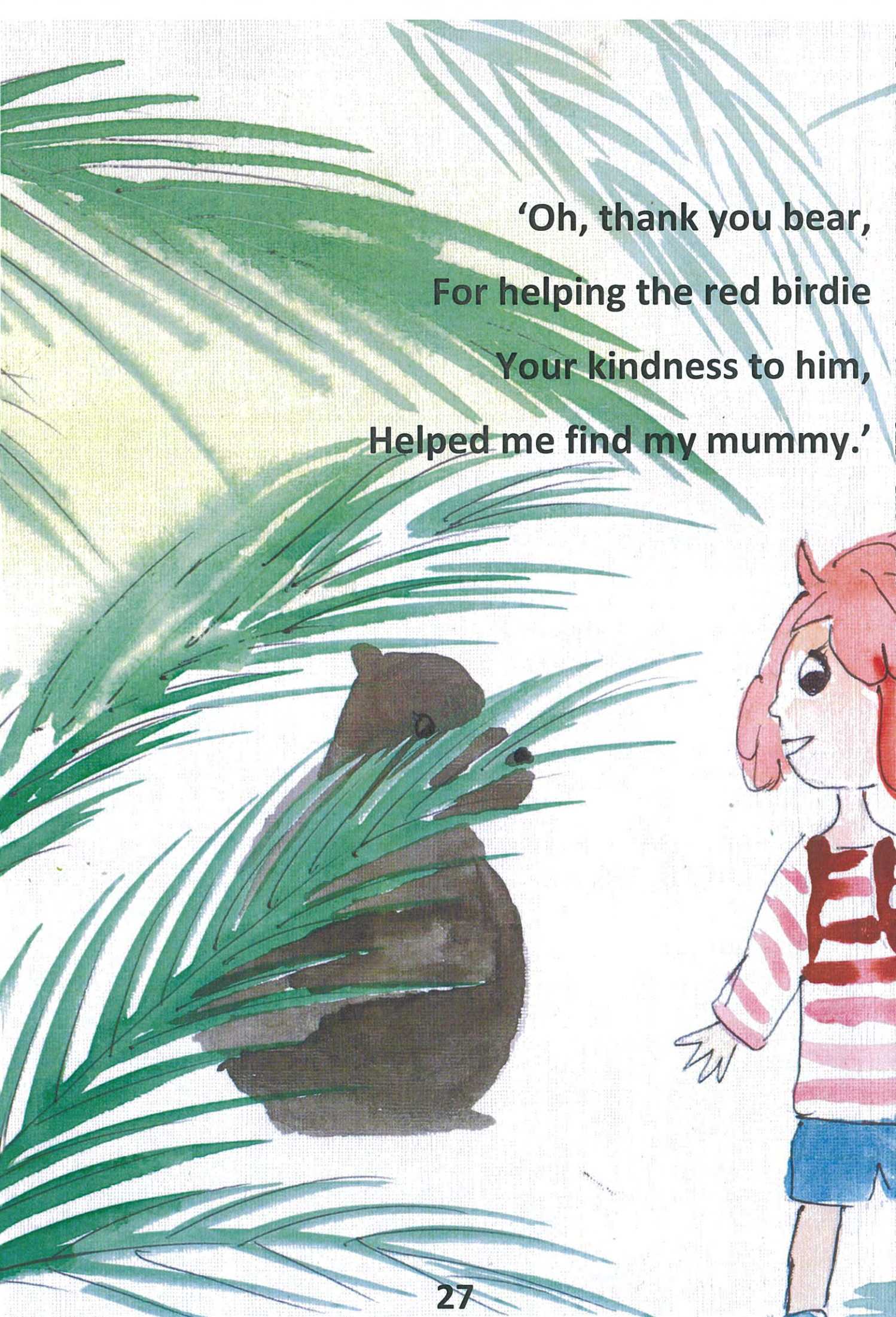


'Don't thank me
Thank the bear

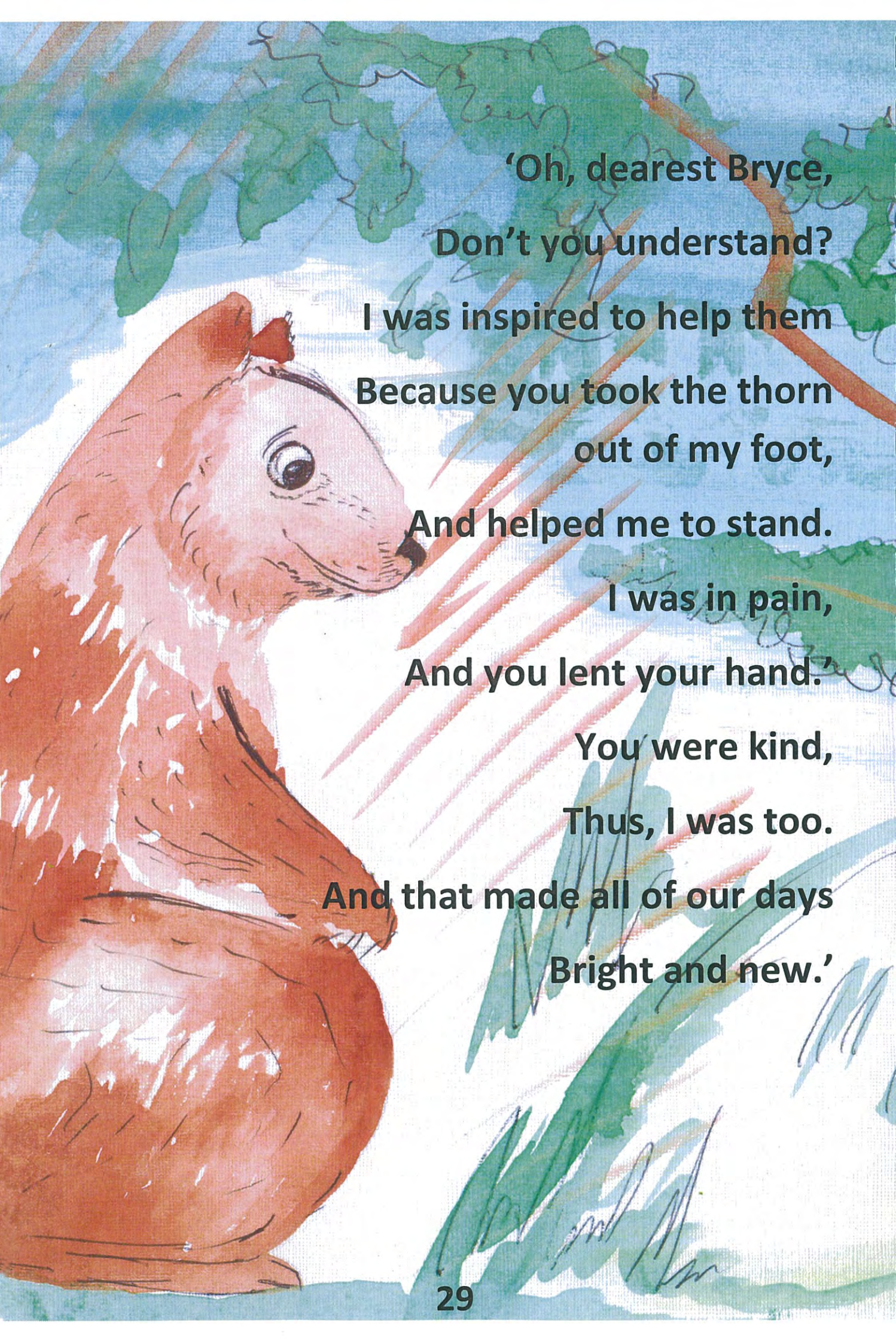
He was the one who
