

GETTING TO KNOW OUR FULL-TIME NATIONAL SERVICEMEN (NSFs)

Did you know that in Singapore, all males are to perform National Service (NS) when they are 18 years old?

National Service personnel have different jobs. They can be in the Singapore Armed Forces (SAF), Singapore Civil Defence Force (SCDF) or Singapore Police Force (SPF).

Singapore Armed Forces (SAF)


Servicemen in the SAF train and work to keep Singapore safe. There are many different jobs in the SAF from being a soldier in the Army, a pilot in the Air Force to keeping our seas safe in the Navy.





The SPF is made up of the policemen we see patrolling our neighbourhoods. They work with the community to keep Singapore safe and respond to incidents when we call 999. They also ensure the safety and security of our buses and trains and patrol Singapore's coasts to prevent any intruders from coming in.
