





Tucker is a young rabbit who lives in Sundown Woods

but their house is all the way at the other side of the woods.




If she wants to get there on time, she must hurry!






Tucker travels there as fast as the wind.

Tucker is curious and follows the voice.




She finds a big brown bear stuck in a hunter's net.

He had big, sharp teeth.




What if this was a trap?

Tucker decides to be kind and help Bobby.




Putting her fears of bears aside, Tucker starts biting

"Thank you, thank you!" Bobby says happily.




Tucker was surprised. This bear did not look as scary as she had imagined.

Oh no, she was going to be late for dinner!


"Are you okay? You look worried!" Bobby asks.




"I am late for dinner!" Tucker cries.

Tucker hops off Bobby's back.




"Thank you so much, Bobby!

I could do for you," Bobby replies.




At dinner, Tucker tells her parents about helping Bobby in the wood.
