


Show your appreciation to National Servicemen



Use **T.H.I.N.K.** to help you reflect on the comments or posts before you share them online. Before you comment or post, ask yourself:

Is it TRUE? Is it HELPFUL?

Is it INSPIRING? Is it NECESSARY? Is it KIND?



Use positive words that will brighten someone's day.



Show respect to others who may have different opinions.



Apologise if something you said or posted online has hurt someone's feelings and remove the post immediately.

DID YOU KNOW?

Practising kindness online is as important as being kind to your family or friends in person. The words you say or type online can hurt someone's feelings, so it is always a good habit to think before you share anything online!


