

"What are you doing?"




"I want to touch the sky!" Jade said excitedly.

The sky is so high."




"Why not climb a tree?

Jade shouted, jumping away.






As Jade left, Ying laughed at her foolishness.

When she reached the surface of the water, she was surprised.




She had never seen anything so bright and blue!

From then on, Jade decided that she was going to reach the sky.






Ying quickly flew to help Jade, but Jade had already landed on a lower branch.

So he decided to plan a surprise for Jade.




Ying thought that
