


# LET'S EXPLORE OUR MULTICULTURAL SINGAPORE

Have you noticed how every celebration in Singapore is just so colourful? Many festivals we celebrate in our communities use colours that have special meaning.

Below are just some examples. You can fill the shapes with the stickers from the sticker page as you explore our multicultural Singapore.





#### Malay-Muslim Culture

Green is a colour that is commonly used by the Muslims. During Hari Raya Puasa celebrations, green packets are given to parents, elderly relatives and children.

Festival decorations are usually green, and food items such as ketupat and lontong (rice cakes) are also wrapped in green leaves.

#### Indian Culture

To the Hindus, the colour red signifies purity. Colours are a feature in traditional art forms like *rangoli* or *kolam*, This is often seen during festivals such as Deepavali.

Colour also plays an important role during weddings as brides are traditionally dressed in red.
