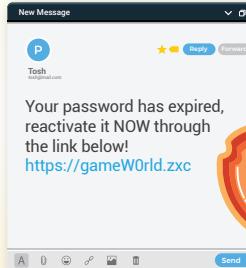

Each time you do something kind at school, plant a seed of kindness in your Kindsville Garden! Use stickers or draw in the flowers to fill the garden with your kind acts.

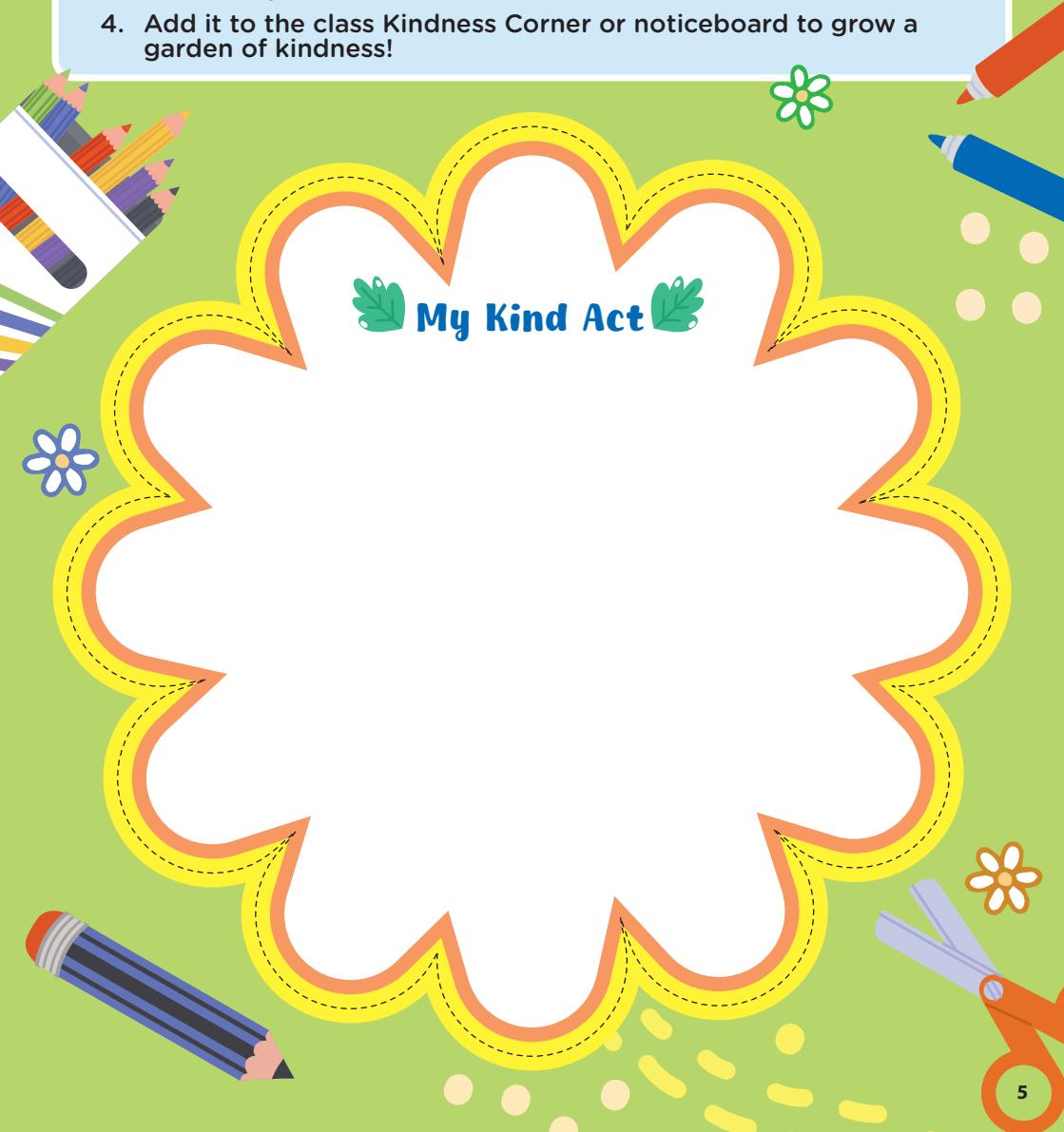

Look out for unsafe attachments.

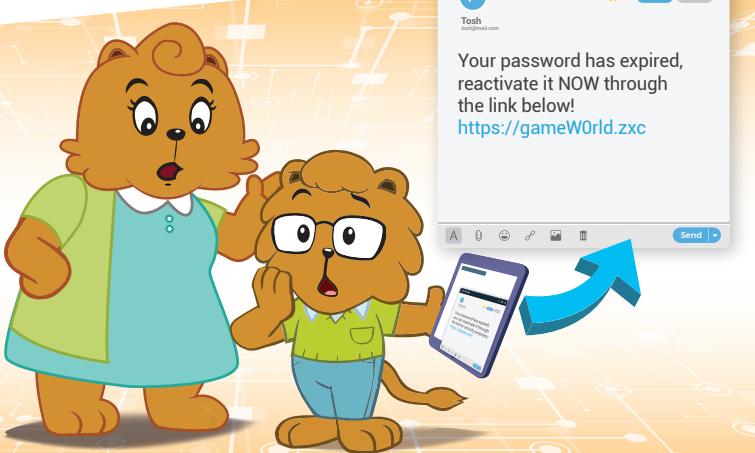

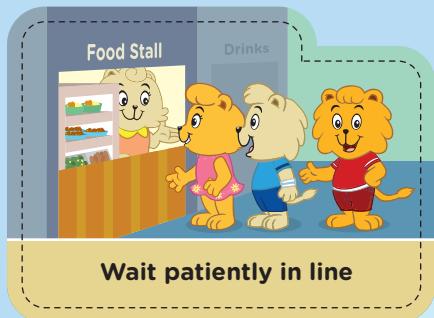
